"TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE TIME"



Nothing should go back to normal. Normal wasn't working. If we go back to the way things were, we will have lost the lesson. May we rise up and do better.

We are heading into a summer of re-set for our church. But we aren't alone. Every church is facing the same transition whether they wish to acknowledge it or not. What will we do with the time we were given during the COVID pandemic? I've counseled with more than a few couples in my ministry. One of the greatest refrains from many is "I just want it back the way it was." But I must remind them, sometimes sternly, "to reset things back to 'the way they were' will only lead you back to here, where you are. The 'way things were' is the reason you are at this point in the first place. You have to want more and better than the 'way things were'.

This is just as true for the church. All our programs, habits, schedules, and traditions have served a great purpose, but they are not eternal nor are they all working, before 2020 or after it.
