## TWO BIBLICAL MESSAGES FOR ALL OF US:

To follow are portions from an article by OPERATION INASMUCH founder, David Crocker. He was a pastor for 38 years prior to launching the OIAM ministry, which has equipped more than 2100 churches in 25 states. **David's** passion is seeing believers serving as the hands and feet of Jesus as a lifestyle:

### 1. SERVING OTHERS IN DISCIPLE-MAKING

"You may think me too simplistic, but it seems to me that disciple-making boils down to helping believers become more like Jesus. What did Jesus do? He served others...in every way you can think of. When they were hungry, he fed them. When they were lonely, he spent time with them. When they were sick, he healed them. When they were guilty of sin, he forgave them. Disciple-making **must** include serving others. One more time: If Jesus was about serving others, and if making disciples is about helping believers become more like Jesus....THEN disciple-making must include a healthy portion of serving others. Not to do so is like attempting to build a Chevy with Ford parts! No matter how hard you work at it, you will not end up with a Chevrolet.

We don't need another book about disciple-making. We already have the best one—the Gospels. Here's the thing: if we (church leaders) would simply give new believers, regardless of age or status or background or anything else, a copy of the Gospels and tell them: "Figure out what Jesus did and what he told his followers to do, and go do it", serving would get a lot more practice and exposure than it does now."



#### 2. READ IT SLOWLY

The second message for us is shared by Rev. Dr. Timothy Lipp, Moderator of the Southside Baptist Association in Kenbridge, VA from their recent newsletter that refers to a daily devotional by Keith Giles that he received:

Sit down tonight with your Bible. Open it to the gospel of Matthew. Find the Sermon on the Mount. Read it slowly. Listen to Jesus and what he commands with a new heart. Allow him to crucify your nationalism and, yes, your political affiliation. Ask him to put to death anything and everything that confuses his authority with any other. I invite you to follow Jesus totally untangled from the powers of this world. I challenge you to do it every day for a month and see if that changes you in any way.

This is a challenge for certain. But isn't that what we have always been called to do as disciples? We follow Jesus. We are to live into the example he set. This is not an ancient word for ancient time. Read it slowly. Pray. Meditate on it. What will be crucified in us? What new life will come? We are all on the journey together!
